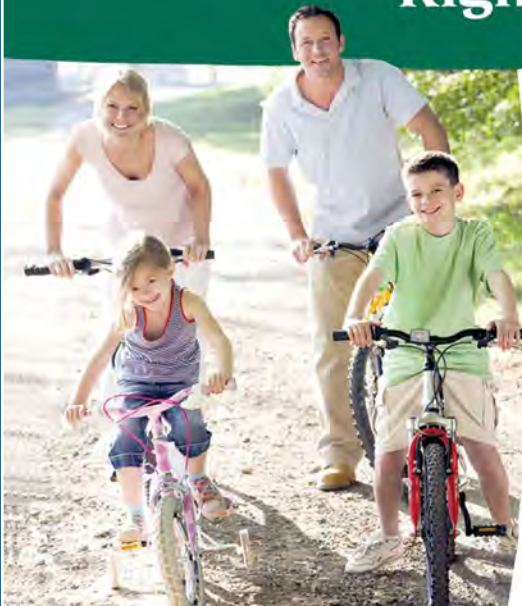

Our beautiful 68 acre property featuring open space, landscaped gardens, verdant trees, and wildlife, is open for the public to enjoy and explore. Pick up a self-guided garden tour booklet in our gift shop and take in the 13 gardens and over 50 varieties of trees

around our grounds. We are happy to share our historic estate is now an accredited Level I arboretum.

Tuesdays through Sundays we offer guided tours of Pearl Buck's former home, the Pearl S. Buck House National Historic Landmark, now a historic house museum with an intact collection that shares her life and legacy.

Our High School Global Leadership Program returns this summer! Open to students in grades 9 through 11, this program is designed to help teens and young adults become better students, college applicants, global citizens, and future leaders. Participants put their newly acquired skills to use working collaboratively on a service project of their choice, with proceeds donated toward Pearl S. Buck International's mission and work. Students will have the opportunity to virtually meet a student from another country; they will also have the opportunity to visit the Pearl S. Buck House, engage in hands on learning, implement real life business tactics, and use a wide variety of technology and inter-personal skills.

### Spring & Summer Safety Reminder

Spring and summer bring warmer weather, outdoor activities, and an increased risk of severe storms and heat. Local Emergency Management encourages residents to stay prepared and informed.

In late February, the Dublin Volunteer Fire Company gathered to recognize its members for another year of hard work and dedication at our annual banquet. We use this event to thank our members, celebrate anniversaries, present awards and honor those we lost throughout the year.

In 2025, we lost two members who's tenure surpassed 129 years when added together. Karen Bishop was a 51-year member of the Ladies Auxiliary and served as secretary for 20 years. We also lost a beloved 78-year member, Elmer Kriebel, who served as our President for more than 30 years. Their commitment and presence will truly be missed.

During the banquet, the fire company presented two awards to individuals whose tireless drive to serve the fire company, and the community truly stands out. The first award, Fireman of the Year, was presented to Rod Shultz. The dedication of Rod is unmatched and difficult to find. Chances are any time you drive past the fire house; you will find his car in the parking lot. He serves as secretary of the fire company and treasurer of the relief association, and on top of those responsibilities, he has taken ownership of the hall and property rentals. He attends nearly all rentals, ensuring the community enjoys their time at their events. Rod also works just about every fire company fundraiser, including our largest, the annual Fireman's Fair. He is truly someone who goes above and beyond what is asked of him and the company is forever grateful for his selflessness and dedication.

The second award is the Chief's Award, presented to an individual the Chief believes has exceeded his or her duties. This year, the award was presented to Carol Shultz, President of the Ladies Auxiliary. As with Rod, you rarely pass the firehouse without seeing her car in the parking lot. She is the definition of irreplaceable. There simply isn't enough room on this page to list all that she does — not only for the Ladies Auxiliary, but for the fire company and the entire community. Her work ethic and drive are second to none. Carol's biggest impacts to the fire company are her involvement in the carnival kitchen, hall rentals and her passion to serve the community.

We continued presenting awards for 2025, recognizing the top five responders of the fire company. Kevin Nugent responded to 158 calls, Anthony Jones and Matt Mayes each responded to 133 calls, Landan Bishop responded to 92 calls, and Alex Fuesner responded to 68 calls. The last two firefighters are junior members who achieved these numbers while still in high school.

Lastly, I expressed my appreciation to all of the officers and members of the company, as the job of Fire Chief certainly could not be done without them. On the administrative side, the department is supported by President Phil Meyers, Vice President Don Strouse, and Secretary Rod Shultz. On the fire operation side, Ken Meyers serves as Deputy Chief, Ryan Hebel as Battalion Chief, and Bill Kirk as Lieutenant. To the officers listed above, as well as the members of the Station 23 and the Dublin Fire Company Ladies Auxiliary, thank you — you have made my job as Chief easy.

## PERMITS ARE REQUIRED

Please contact the Borough at {215} 249-3310 to confirm if a permit is required.

**Building and/or Zoning Permit**- required for any residential, commercial or industrial construction. Construction includes but is not limited to: new construction, additions, alterations, demolition, swimming pools and accessory structures. Accessory structures may include but are not limited to: storage sheds, detached garages, patios, decks, retaining walls, barns, silos, above and in-ground pools, hot tubs, above-ground and in-ground storage tanks, fireplaces, etc.

**Zoning Permit**-required for signs, fences, home occupation registration, wells and other reasons.

**Moving Permit**-required when moving into, out of or within Dublin Borough.

**Park Permit**-required in order to reserve the pavilion at Supplee Park.

Other permits may be required for certain activities.

It is the owners responsibility to ensure that applications submitted to the Borough are in compliance with any Homeowners Association Bylaws and/or Covenants.

# A Message from our Tax Collector Susan Paff

## IMPORTANT information regarding USPS postmark policy\*\*\*

The U.S. Postal Service (USPS) has implemented a significant change to postmark dates beginning December 24, 2025. This means your mail is now postmarked with the date that it hits automated sorting equipment at a regional center, often days after you drop it off, impacting time-sensitive items like tax forms, bills, and ballots.

To ensure an accurate, same-day postmark, you **MUST** take mail inside a local Post Office and request a manual hand-stamp postmark.



### What's Changing

- Old Rule: Postmark usually reflected the date you put mail in a box or at the counter.
- New Rule: Postmark shows the date it is first processed by a machine at a regional sorting facility, which can be days later.

### Why This Matters

- Deadlines & Due Dates: Agencies like the IRS and courts use postmark dates for filings, payments, and ballots, so a delayed postmark could mean your mail is considered late, resulting in penalties or rejections.
- Examples: Tax returns, rent checks, legal documents, any date sensitive bills (i.e. tax payments, utility payments) and mail-in ballots are all affected.


### How To Get An On-Time Postmark

- Hand-Stamp: Go inside any Post Office and ask for a manual postmark on the date you are mailing.
- Certified Mail: Using certified mail provides a dated receipt.
- Mail Early: Mail time-sensitive items several days before the deadline to account for potential processing delays.

## DUBLIN BOROUGH FLUSHING NOTICE

Dublin Borough will be flushing the water distribution system the evening of May 18, 2026, and the evening of May 19, 2026.

**Flushing will take place between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m.**

Please refrain from using water during this time as it may draw sediment into your service line. Customers may experience low pressure and temporary discoloration of water. If discoloration persists, please let it settle for a minimum of a half hour. Then run the COLD water for a few minutes.

If the problem persists, customers should contact our office at (215) 249-3310. If you have any water softeners, they should be turned off to prevent back siphoning of the softening media.

Additionally, we urge you to check your wash water prior to doing laundry.

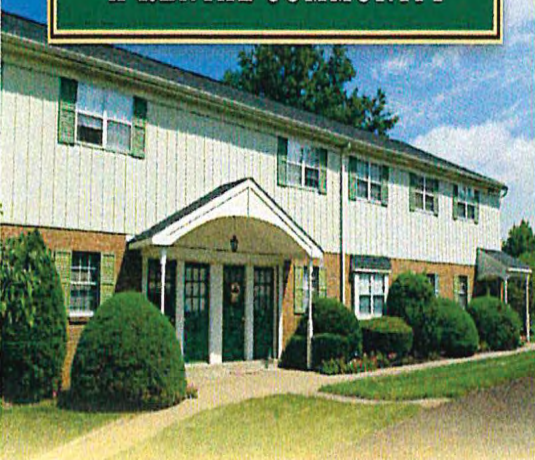
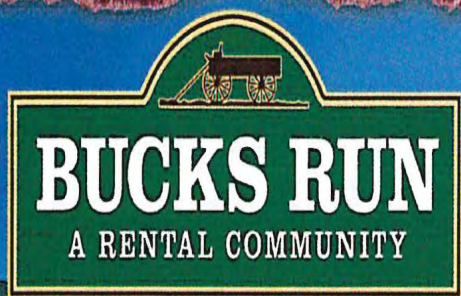

## REMINDERS

### Grass & Weed Maintenance

As a reminder, it is a violation of Borough Ordinance No 105 to permit grass or weeds to grow in excess of twelve inches. Please check your property and sidewalks regularly to ensure that you remain in compliance. Failure to comply shall give cause to Borough Authorities to have the same removed at a minimum cost of \$25.00 together with any additional penalty to be collected.



### Leaf Disposal Reminder

As a reminder, do not blow or rake leaves into the street or roadway. Leaves can clog storm drains, cause flooding and create slippery road hazards for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians. Please bag your leaves and place them out for yard waste collection which is scheduled the last Saturday of the month. Contact Whitetail Disposal at (610) 936-9967 to be added to the collection list. ### Trees and Sidewalks



Per Ordinance 318, trees must be kept trimmed with no branches hanging over the roadway into the sidewalk and the vegetation upon the property along or near to any street in the Borough must be maintained.



### Trash/Recycling Toters

To keep our Borough safe, clean and accessible for everyone, please follow these guidelines: Place trash and recycling out no earlier than the evening before your scheduled collection day. Remove empty containers promptly after pick up. Keeping sidewalks clear ensures safe passage for pedestrians, strollers and wheelchairs. We appreciate your cooperation.

# UPCOMING ROAD WORK

As part of the Borough's commitment to maintaining safe and reliable infrastructure for residents, we will be repaving Rickert Road on the Hilltown Township side this summer. The work will be conducted on the stretch of roadway from North Main Street to the State Police Barracks. It is anticipated to begin mid-June, weather permitting. The project will consist of roadway milling and paving, base repair, leveling course and line striping. The Borough and the contractor will work to minimize disruptions and maintain access whenever possible. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we work to improve our Borough roads.

# MOYER FARM PROJECT

Over the past few weeks, you have probably noticed construction activity at the Moyer Farm property located along North Main Street at Rickerts Road. The approximately 32.9-acre tract has been approved by Borough Council and the Dublin Borough and Bucks County Planning Commissions for development within the Borough's Planned Village Development (PVD) District. The plan includes 68 dwelling units, consisting of 14 twin dwellings and 54 village houses, a three-story building with approximately 45 apartments and an adaptive re-use of the barn for commercial use. In addition, this project will complete the Comprehensive Road which will run parallel to North Main Street, connecting Elephant Road to Rickerts Road. This project represents one of the most significant land development efforts within the Borough in recent years.

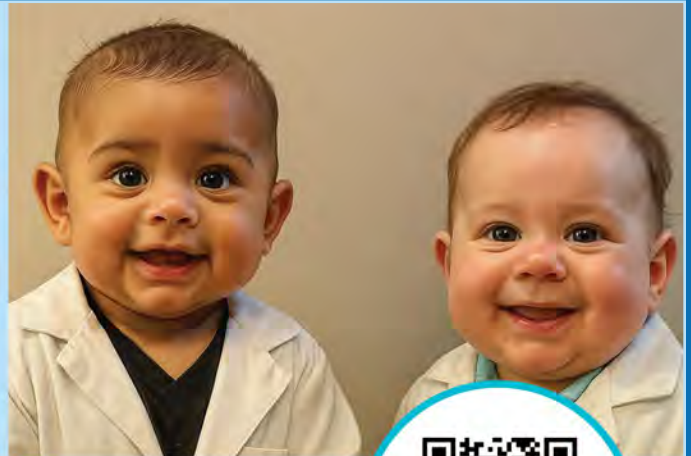

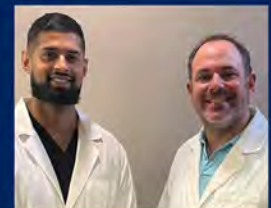
