All real estate tax bills are mailed directly to the property owner. Bucks County/ Dublin Borough real estate tax bills are issued March 1 of each year. Pennridge School District real estate tax bills are issued July 1 of each year. If you do not receive a bill within 2 weeks of those dates, please contact the tax office (email preferred) for a copy of the bill to be forwarded to you.

For your convenience, a Dropbox for payments is available at the Borough office entrance. Payments can also be made by mail to the address listed on the tax bills.

If a paid receipt is required, enclose your entire tax bill along with a self-addressed stamped envelope. The "Taxpayer" copy will be stamped with the paid date and returned to you. In person payment collection dates are listed on the current tax bills. Due to incidents of counterfeit money, no cash is accepted.

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EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

As Spring is upon us, now is a good time to freshen up a few things around the house in preparation for an emergency.

1. Review over your emergency plan with all family members. This should include a gathering point in case it is needed.
2. Look through your emergency supplies.

A basic emergency supplies kit could include the following recommended items:

- Water (one gallon per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation)
- Food (at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food)
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
- Flashlight, extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place)
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- Manual can opener (for food)
- Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery

Some additional items that you may want to include in your kit may be:

Face coverings (for everyone ages 2 and above), soap, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes to disinfect surfaces

- Prescription medications
- Non-prescription medications such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medication, antacids or laxatives
- Prescription eyeglasses and contact lens solution
- Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes and diaper rash cream
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Cash or traveler's checks
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Complete change of clothing appropriate for your climate and sturdy shoes
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

Please extend common courtesy to other park users and abide by all posted rules and regulations when visiting the Borough's Park –

1. Park is open from sunrise to sunset.
2. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
3. Children 10 years and under must be supervised by a responsible guardian 14 years or older.
4. Motor vehicles are permitted only in designated parking lots.
5. Abuse and/or profane language is prohibited.
6. Only charcoal fires are permitted in mounted grills and attended by a person 18 years or older. Extinguish coals after use. Do not place hot coals in litter cans.
7. Pets must be on a leash. Remove deposits from ground.
8. Place litter and trash in litter can.

EXPERIENCE MATTERS

“Veteranosity” is a sports term that is sometimes heard in reference to a professional team. You won’t find the word in the Webster’s Dictionary, nor in the Urban Dictionary, but it refers to a team that is talented, experienced, and has “been there” before. “Veteranosity” is a term that today can be applied to your Dublin Borough Police Department.

Many small boroughs and townships that use part-time police officers rely on new officers that have just completed their police academy training and are looking to enter the field. This is not a bad thing as it brings new blood into the profession. The downside is that these officers are looking for full-time work and eventually move on to other departments. Additionally, they do not bring experience or specialized training to the municipality. Our police department is fortunate to have hired part-time officers that are not only experienced but also bring various forms of specialized training to us. These officers currently work full-time at other agencies or have retired from other agencies and want to continue to do police work part-time.



Chief Michael Regan: Served 44 years in law enforcement, 37 of which were with Cheltenham Township. Most of those years were as a supervisor and he oversaw at various times: patrol squads, the communications center, the field training of new officers, the civil affairs unit, and the drug task force. He has also trained at various Command and Executive police schools.

Sergeant William Kirk: Served 32 years in law enforcement all with the Dublin Borough Police Department (DBPD). He is a certified motorcycle officer, a Field Training Officer, and our Community Events coordinator as well as our patrol supervisor.

Sergeant Wayne Jones: Served 38 years in law enforcement; 37 of which have been with the DBPD. He works full time with the Central Bucks Regional Police Department and has experience in SWAT, Detectives, Highway/Accident Investigations, and as a supervisor.

Officer Dan Gol: Served 36 years in law enforcement with agencies that include the PA Fish Commission, Yardley Borough, and the Bucks Rangers. He has been a narcotics officer, a MIRT team member, and a firearms instructor and armorer.

Officer Robert Burkhardt: Served 36 years in law enforcement, the bulk of which was in New Britain Township. He has also served Lancaster City, Chalfont Borough, and is currently with the Bucks County Rangers. He is a traffic crash reconstructionist, is ARIDE certified, and an OC spray instructor.

Officer Pat Bastek: Served 19 years in law enforcement including the Scranton Police Department, the Philadelphia Sheriff’s Department, and the Bucks County Sheriffs. He is in the Bucks County MIRT Unit and has been a certified police bicycle officer.

Officer Michael Meisner: Served 17 years in law enforcement including the Bucks County Prison, Pendel Police Department, and the Bucks County Rangers. He is a certified MPOETC Instructor and instructs in many areas including SFST, Control Tactics and defensive tactics. Some of his other specialties include MIRT, firearms armorer, FTO, and drug investigations.

Officer Rhiannon Browne: Has served 3.5 years in law enforcement with Dublin Borough as well as the Bucks County Sheriffs. Specialties include crisis intervention, mental health, addiction and recovery, and civil unrest.

Officer John Foster: has served 23 years in law enforcement including with the Lower Moreland Police, Spring City Police, North Wales Police, and the Montgomery County Sheriffs. He is a bomb technician, Taser instructor, firearms instructor, FTO, and CERT officer.

FROM THE OFFICE OF STATE REPRESENTATIVE SHELBY LABS

As I begin my third term, it remains a tremendous honor to serve as your State Representative. This is an honor I do not take lightly, and as we begin a new legislative session, I will continue to fight to bring results back to our community. I was proud to work with Senator Coleman to secure several grants for Dublin Borough which include the purchase and upfit of a new police vehicle in the amount of \$83,983, \$81,000 to renovate the Dublin Village Greene Detention Basin, and \$1.25 million which will go towards the continued revitalization efforts of the Borough.

Please remember that the federal REAL ID Act will go into effect on May 7th. While this is a federal requirement and not mandatory to obtain in Pennsylvania, according to federal law you will need to present a federally accepted form of identification to board a commercial domestic flight or visit a secure federal building that requires ID for entry. Federally accepted forms of identification include a Pennsylvania REAL ID compliant driver's license or ID card, a U.S. passport or passport card, or a military ID.

Additionally, the application period for the state's 2024 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program is now open for eligible Pennsylvanians to begin claiming rebates on property taxes or rent paid in 2024. Income limits have increased this year to \$46,520 annually for both homeowners and renters, with the maximum rebate increased to \$1,000. Remember to exclude 50% of Social Security when determining your income. The program is open to residents aged 65 years and older; widows and widowers 50 years and older; and people with disabilities 18 years and older. Remember, you do not need to pay anyone for assistance to apply for the rebate. You can apply online at mypath.pa.gov, or contact my office at 215-489-2126 to schedule an appointment.

Please save the date for my annual spring shredding event which will be held on May 31st from 10 am to noon at Grasse Elementary school, located at 600 Rickert Road, Sellersville (Hilltown Township.) This is a free event and a great opportunity to dispose of unwanted confidential documents.

My offices will continue to offer services and host events that benefit you, including SEPTA Senior Fare Card applications and renewals, PennDOT assistance, and state agency assistance. Please contact my offices with any questions regarding these or other services, as well as any additional questions about REAL ID and the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program. My office is located at the Silo Hill Professional Building, 1032 N. Easton Road in Plumstead Township and can be reached at 215-489-2126. Accessory structures may include but are not limited to: storage sheds, detached garages, patios, decks, retaining walls, barns, silos, above and in-ground pools, hot tubs, above-ground and in-ground storage tanks, fireplaces, etc.

Zoning Permit-required for signs, fences, home occupation registration, wells and other reasons.

Moving Permit-required when moving into, out of or within Dublin Borough.

Park Permit-required in order to reserve the pavilion at Supplee Park.

Other permits may be required for certain activities.

It is the owners responsibility to ensure that applications submitted to the Borough are in compliance with any Homeowners Association Bylaws and/or Covenants.
